

Don Low Fellowship Opportunities in Laboratory Animal Medicine

The Don Low Fellowship program provides veterinarians with interest in career opportunities in laboratory animal medicine/pathology/surgery/administration and facility management to experience the wide range of research support activities clinical laboratory animal veterinarians at UC-Davis perform. Generally, the program is best suited for individuals who already have research experience and may have current biotechnology or research animal facility affiliation professionally but desire exposure to a large institution's lab animal program to extend their knowledge during preparation for the ACLAM board exam. They should have a desire to gain clinical experience in the provision of adequate veterinary care and utilize the opportunity of the Don Low Fellowship to broaden their clinical experience both in lab animal program management through animal use protocol review discussions and selected clinical case management or disease outbreak management situations. Attendance at seminars and training sessions alongside residents in the lab animal training program is welcomed. Don Low fellows may want to develop in consultation with Dr. Terry Hewett (Director of the Center for Laboratory Animal Science), an individually tailored educational program to help them achieve specific lab animal focused objectives as defined in the ACLAM Role Delineation Document.
