Rocky mountain spotted fever at your doorstep: What a veterinarian needs to know Janet Foley, DVM, PhD

- Attendees will learn the basic ecology of Rocky Mountain spotted fever and other spotted fever group rickettsioses, including how it is transmitted, high-risk geographical areas, and spatial patterns of the vector tick and the disease.
- Attendees will understand the epidemiology of RMSF and risk factors at the level of the human patient, the dog, and the community.
- We will discuss community-based interventions that may reduce risk.

Prevention and management of challenging RMSF cases in dogs

- Attendees will be able to describe clinical similarities and differences between RMSF and other tick-borne diseases in dogs.
- Attendees will be able to identify clinical signs and historical risk factors that create an index of suspicion for RMSF in dogs.
- Attendees will be able to recommend appropriate diagnostic testing for RMSF and interpret the results of diagnostic tests.

Sustainability in Veterinary Medicine

Diccon Westworth, BVSc, DACVIM (Neurology)

- To understand the causes and effects of anthropogenic climate change on human and animal health.
- To understand the importance of carbon literacy and how to calculate our carbon footprint To define sustainability in general terms and introduce the concept of the triple bottom line.
- To recognize the role that we can play in addressing the environmental crisis: sustainable pet ownership and sustainable veterinary healthcare provision.
- To recognize the areas where changes can be made in clinical practice to reduce the environmental impact of health care (energy source and use, procurement, waste management, use of pharmaceuticals and green prescribing, lower flow anesthesia, block anesthesia).
- Understand the business case for sustainability in terms of mental well-being, staff recruitment, retention, client engagement and operational resilience.
